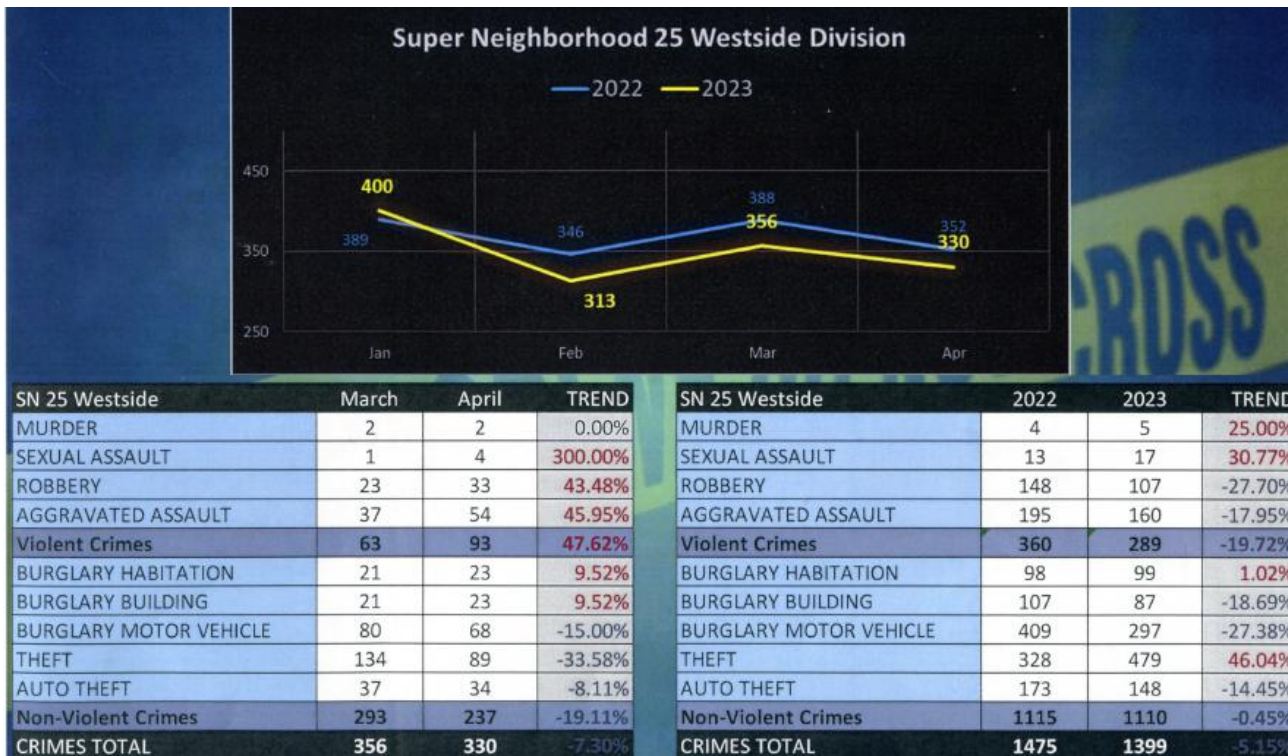
Citizens Working Together to Improve the Quality of Life in Alief

Meeting Minutes for May23, 2023

The regularly scheduled meeting was convened at 6:35 pm by Chair Barbara Quattro. Board members present were Doug Smith, Treasurer, and Alan Steinberg, Vice Chair.

Treasurer’s Report: We have \$999.59 in our account as of the meeting date.

Alief Houston Police Department Report: Westside Command Center crime statistics for the Alief area. Crime statistics are as follows:

Speaker: Blake Hopkins, Lincoln Avenue Capital

The largest undeveloped tract of land in Alief is the 148-acre space formerly known as Sugar Hill. In recent years, several attempts have been made to develop the property which has building restrictions because it was a dump site several decades ago. According to Mr. Hopkins, Lincoln Avenue Capital is proposing building an affordable 264-unit apartment complex on 11 acres at that site. The complex will feature not only an onsite after school education program, but also other property amenities including a dog park, playground, fitness facility, and resident garden; all of which will be free to residents. The site is near public transportation, a grocery store, pharmacies, and other local amenities. The Alief Super Neighborhood Council provided a letter of support for this proposed project.

Speakers: Ryan Prillman and Michael Johnson, City of Houston Public Works

These speakers provided information on conserving water consumption as the City adds additional residents and industries. Residential conservation includes: (1) checking and fixing toilet leaks. A leaking toilet can waste up to 200 gallons per day; (2) replacing showerheads with a Water Sense labeled showerhead. According to the Public Works website, the average family could save 2700 gallons per year by installing Water Sense labeled showerheads. The City of Houston Plumbing Codes requires showerheads to use no more than 2.0 gallons per minute; (3) take shorter showers; (4) turn off the faucet while brushing teeth or shaving; (5) install water-efficient faucets and aerators. David Nguyen, Harris County Precinct 4 Community Engagement Coordinator:

- Precinct 4 is defining and planning the \$2 million ARPA contract which will provide trees for Alief esplanades.
- Precinct 4 will study potential options to increase mobility capacity within the Westpark Tollway. This study is necessary to keep pace with growth, expand economic opportunities and improve quality of life for residents.

Isaac Iguia, District F Chief of Staff

Current activities include:

- Streamlining meetings and scheduling procedures
- BYOB permits at gaming rooms
- Summer of Safety program which starts with a Public Safety Town Hall on June 26

Veronica Hernandez, Mayor's Assistance Office Assistance:

Veronica's schedule will not include office hours at the Alief Neighborhood Center on Tuesdays and Wednesdays. She announced a Memorial Day event at Bear Creek Park which will start at 2:00 pm. :

Chair Barbara Quattro announced that The Empty Shelter Project which provides free spay/neuter microchipping and vaccines to Alief residents, will be at the Alief Career Center on Saturday, June 3rd. Volunteers are needed for the event. Also, the ASNC planted 1200+ trees on Alief esplanades during the planting 2022-2023 planting season.
